BOAT



1. Using template draw outline of boat on a piece of scrap 2x4 pine wood.
2. Cut out using a skill saw.
3. Sand, lightly stain if desired.
4. Drill two holes $\frac{1}{2}$ " deep for $\frac{1}{4}$ " dowels:
one $1\frac{1}{8}$ " from ship front, second $2\frac{1}{2}$ " from front



MASTS



BACK MAST: cut 4"

FRONT MAST: cut 3"

1. Cut two 1/4" thick dowels to above lengths.
2. Cut the top of both masts off at a 45 degree angle.
3. Cut diagonal notches into the dowels
Measuring down 1/2" from the top of the mast:
Cuts on the front mast=1.5" apart
On back mast=2" apart
4. Glue dowels into holes with notches facing forward & angled to one side.



SAILS



1. Using sails templates, trace onto cardstock one large and one small sail.
2. Insert small one on foremast and larger one on main mast
